The Reach of the State: Work Units, Social Ties and Resistance Control in China

This paper draws on interviews and archival sources to explore how Chinese local governments exploit work units (*danwei*) and social ties to control urban resistance. It shows that when a protest takes place, relevant work units are often assigned to quiet down their contentious employees. When protest participants are independent of work units, their close relatives on the public payroll are frequently made responsible to persuade them to sit out protest. The paper suggests that while the reach of work units and social ties empowers the local state in protest control, frequent use of such approaches alienates elite members of society and impairs regime legitimacy.
